PRIZES:

3 points will be awarded for 1st place, 2 points for 2nd, 1 point for 3rd. Trophies are awarded to the people with the most points in Photography, Vegetables, Fruit, Flowers, Domestic, Arts & Crafts, Woodwork & Metalwork and each Children's age section. Certificates are awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each class—these will be left on the tables for collection by the winners.

The overall Show Cup will go to the Haversham or Little Linford resident with the most points obtained in Classes 1 to 64. In the event of a tie, the entrant with the most first then second places will win. There is also an award for the family with most points in all classes.

Special awards:

- The **Pat Brightman trophy** will go to the best exhibit in the children's classes.
- The **Bill Bedford trophy** will be awarded to the best photograph entered by a child.
- The **Best Single Exhibit** shield goes to the best exhibit as judged by the Social & Community Centre Committee.
- The **Novice's Award** goes to the person whose first-ever entry in a class is judged best by the Parish Council.
- This year's **Haversham Allotments & Gardens Society Award** will go to the overall best Horticultural exhibit in Classes 10 to 30, as judged by the Horticultural judge.

SHOW RULES:

1. Entry Fees: Children - 20p per entry Adults - 50p per entry
2. Entry forms with entry fee must be in by no later than **Thursday 31st August**, to Jackie Brown, 39 The Crescent or Lesley Gilbert at Woodpecker Cottage. **N.B. No entries will be accepted on the day.**
3. All entries must be made/grown by the exhibitor, except Classes 33 to 37 and Children's Classes 73 and 79.
4. This show is open to all. However the 'Overall' trophy will only go to a Haversham or Little Linford resident.
5. All entries must be in place by **10.45 am**.
6. No entries to be removed before **4.00 pm**.
7. During judging, no one other than the judges and stewards are permitted to be inside the hall.
8. Stewards may not have entries in the section of the show that they are stewarding.
9. Jams etc. must be in a 1lb/454g jar. They must **not** have metal lids and need to be labelled and dated.
10. Exhibitors may **only exhibit one entry per class**, due to limited space.
11. Previous entries are not acceptable.
12. Vases for flowers will not be supplied.
13. Exhibits are placed at the exhibitor's own risk.
14. The judge's decision is final.

Unless otherwise specified above, photographs can be any size up to A4, may be colour or black & white and may be mounted on card but not framed.

VEGETABLES

- Class 10** - 4 carrots with a minimum of 3" tops
Class 11 - A plate of 4 runner beans
Class 12 - A plate of 4 French beans
Class 13 - A mis-shaped or ugly vegetable
Class 14 - Group of 3 equal sized white potatoes
Class 15 - Group of 3 equal sized coloured potatoes
Class 16 - A plate of 4 tomatoes
Class 17 - A plate of 4 cherry tomatoes
Class 18 - 3 beetroots with tops
Class 19 - Cucumber - indoor grown
Class 20 - 4 onions (equal size and colour)
Class 21 - A plate of 6 Shallots
Class 22 - Heaviest Marrow
Class 23 - A plate of a single variety of vegetable not listed above with a minimum of 1 and maximum of 3 examples
Class 24 - A mixed basket of vegetables (1 of each of 6 varieties of Vegetables, parsley garnish allowed, maximum 24"/60cm diameter)
Class 25 - Salad Bowl (minimum of 4 varieties of salad items, maximum 18"/45cm diameter)

Where presenting items on a plate, please use a paper plate.

FRUIT

- Class 26** - A plate of 4 cooking apples of equal size
Class 27 - A plate of 4 dessert apples of equal size
Class 28 - A plate of 3 pears

Class 29 - A plate of 4 plums

Class 30 - A plate of a single variety of fruit not listed above with a minimum of 3 and maximum of 5 examples.

Where presenting items on a plate, please use a paper plate.

FLOWERS

Class 31 - A single Rose in a vase

Class 32 - 3 Dahlias in a vase (any variety—mix and match)

Class 33 - A Pot Plant—foliage or flowering, indoor or outdoor (one pot not to exceed 8"/20cm diameter)

Class 34 - An arrangement on the theme of Harvest to include foliage, fruits and/or berries but with minimum use of flowers.

Class 35 - A Tussie-Mussie (a small flower arrangement of fragrant herbs and blooms), not to exceed 6"/15cm in length.

Class 36 - A floral arrangement on the theme of King Charles III's Coronation, maximum height 14"/35cm. Natural plant material to predominate but a little artificial material allowed.

Class 37 - A Cushion of Flowers celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III, not to exceed 14"/35cm in diameter

DOMESTIC

Class 38 - A 1lb (454gm) jar of any flavour of Jam

Class 39 - A 1lb (454gm) jar of Marmalade

Class 40 - A 1lb (454gm) jar of Lemon Curd

Class 41 - A 1lb (454gm) jar of Chutney

Class 42 - A plate of cheese scone round - recipe supplied*

Class 43 - A plate of millionaire's shortbread—recipe supplied*

Class 44 - An apple cake - recipe supplied*

Class 45 - A Cornish pasty - recipe supplied*

Class 46 - A ciabatta loaf—recipe supplied*

Class 47 - A lemon drizzle loaf cake - recipe supplied*

Class 48 - A Bara Brith teabread - recipe supplied*

Class 49 - ***open only to novices in the domestic classes #*** - a plate of 3 blueberry muffins - own recipe.

ARTS & CRAFTS

Class 51 - An embroidery, cross-stitch, tapestry or lace sample.

Class 52 - A hand-made knitted or crocheted garment.

Class 53 - A hand-made Congratulations card.

Class 54 - A hand-made toy rabbit.

Class 55 - A hand-made cushion - maximum 10"/25cm square.

Class 56 - An item of homemade jewellery in any material.

Class 57 - An original written creative work, maximum size A4.

Class 58 - Any other item not included in the above classes

Class 59 - A painting of a Milton Keynes landmark.

Class 60 - Any other painting, in any medium

Class 61 - An item of wood turning

Class 62 - A multi-media sculpture, not exceeding 10"/25cm in diameter or 18"/45cm in height

Class 63 - A metal candleholder for house or garden.

Class 64 - A bird's nesting box, made predominantly of wood.

CHILDREN'S CLASSES

Toddler—Under 3 years of age on day of show

Class 65 - A decorated gingerbread man (the biscuit does not have to be homemade)

Class 66 - A zoo-themed collage on a paper plate

Junior—3 or over and under 7 years of age on day of show

Class 67 - 4 decorated rice krispie cakes

Class 68 - A zoo-themed collage on a paper plate

Class 69 - A bug hotel, made using recycled materials

Class 70 - A jar of common or garden flowers

Middle—7 or over and under 10 years of age on day of show

Class 71 - 4 homemade biscuits, decorated - own recipe

Class 72 - 4 homemade chocolate muffins - own recipe

Class 73 - A mini scarecrow made from vegetables, not to exceed 12" /30cm in height or width

Class 74 - An Acrostic poem on the theme of King Charles III's Coronation, not to exceed 9 lines.

Class 75 - A miniature shopfront/s display, any shape up to 15in/40cm square/ diameter

Class 76 - A photograph of a Milton Keynes landmark.
